Ephesians 1:7; “In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace.”

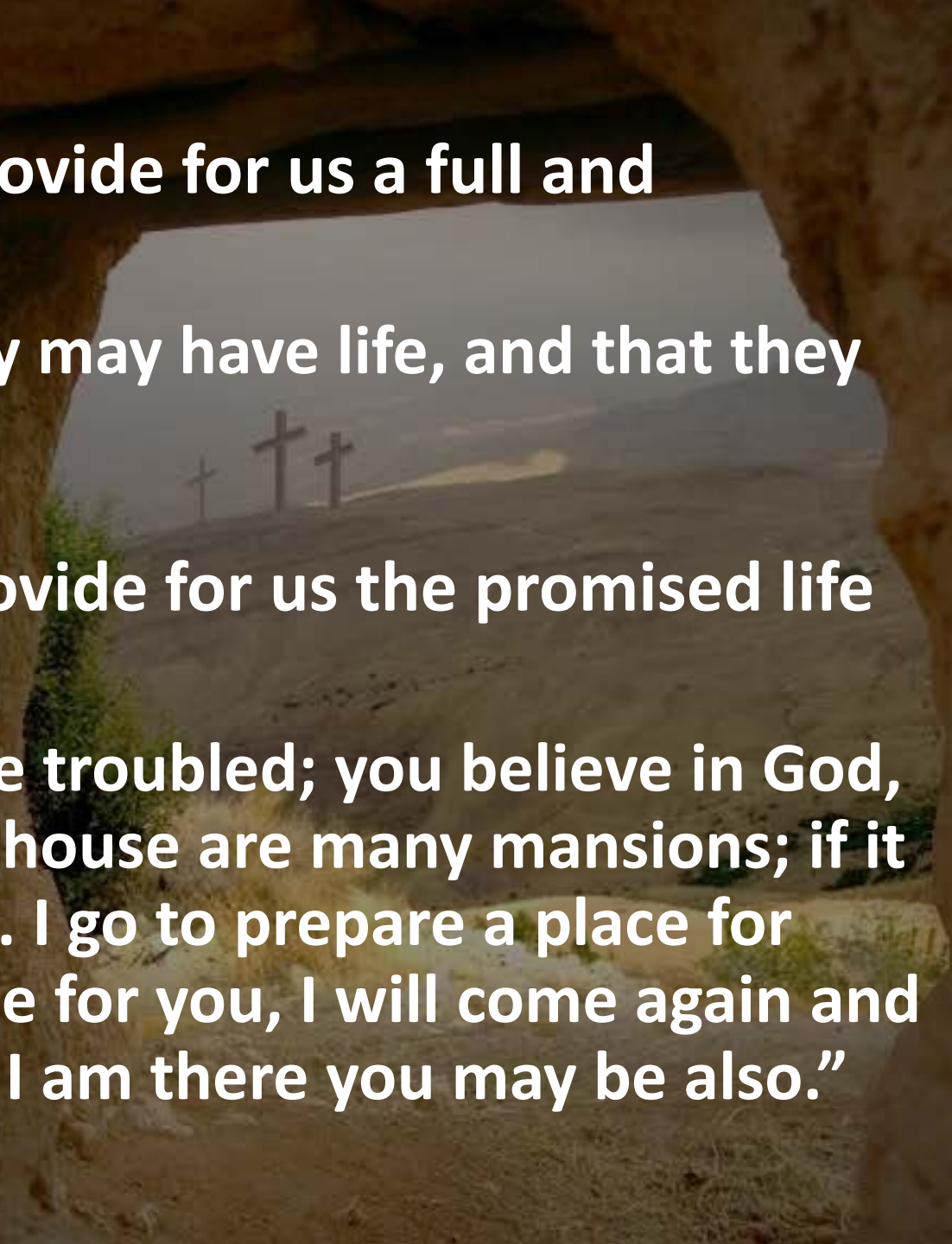
John 6:40; “And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day.”
