



a) It identifies us with Christ:

Baptism illustrates a believer's identification with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection.

Romans 6:3-4; "Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."

b) It is our first step of obedience and public confession:

Matthew 3: 17; "And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, this is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

c) It identifies us with His resurrection:

2 Cor. 5:17; "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold all thing are become new."

Romans 6:4; "....even so we also should walk in newness of life."

d) It identifies us with our new allegiance to our new Master:

Paul taught in the book of Philippians that after our new birth some exciting things happen in our lives.
